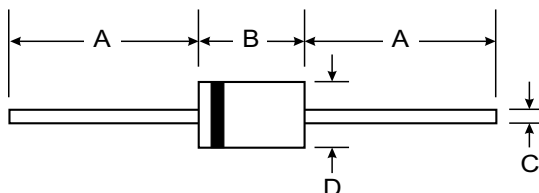


Features

FIG.1 – FORWARD DERATING CURVE

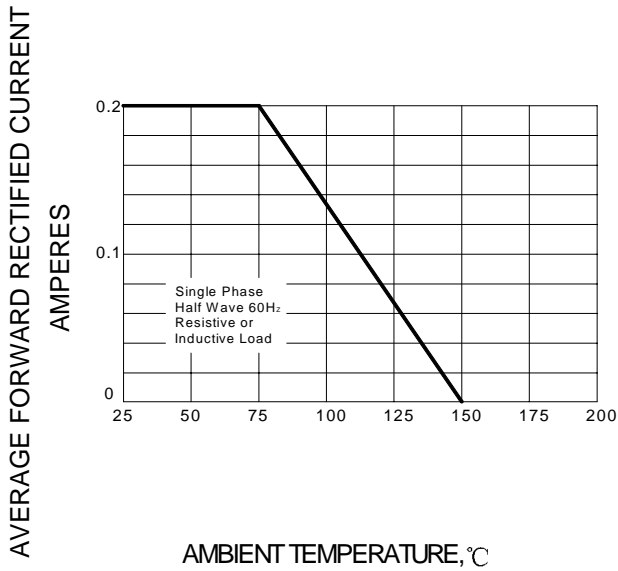


FIG.2 – PEAK FORWARD SURGE CURRENT

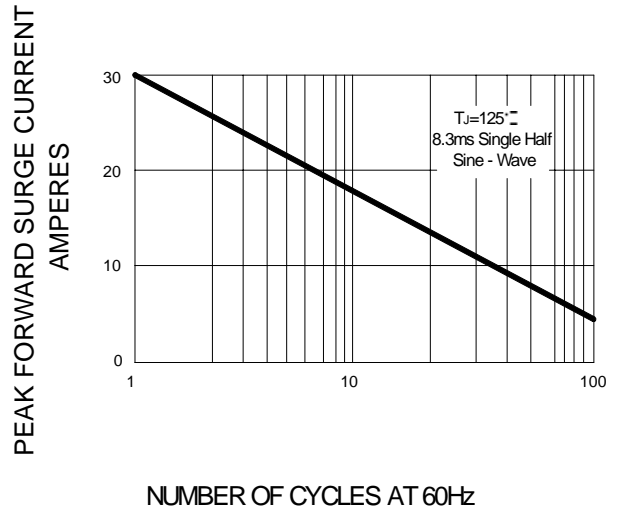
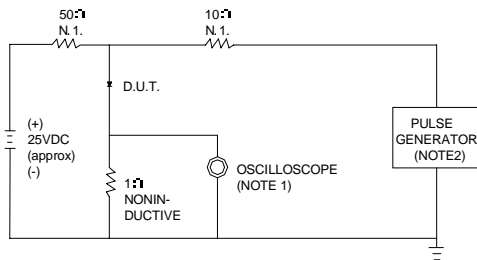
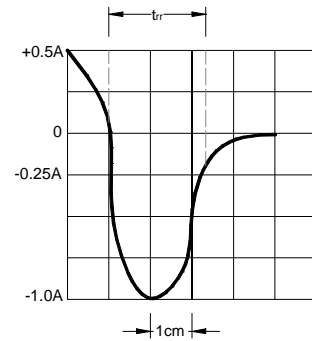


FIG.3 – TEST CIRCUIT DIAGRAM AND REVERSE RECOVERY TIME CHARACTERISTIC
